Happy New Year?

"I delight greatly in the Lord; my soul rejoices in my God. For he has clothed me with garments of salvation and arrayed me in a robe of his righteousness" Isaiah 61:10

At the beginning of a new year, it is customary to greet each other with "Happy New Year!" Do we mean "day" rather than "year"? Are we still saying it on the seventh day of the new year? Can you be happy if, in the coming year, you may have less to eat, if you must make old clothes last for another year, if a vacation is out of the question, and if you must worry about the bills coming due?

Christians have good reason to be the happiest people in the world. Their happiness is not based on the condition of the world but on the condition of the heart. They are happy because of God and not because of man, just as Isaiah said, "I delight greatly in the Lord; my soul rejoices in my God."

According to Scripture, each of us is born in slavery to sin and Satan, coming into a world that has fallen under the power of Satan, groaning and miserable with fear and worry, facing everlasting gloom and destruction.

But Christians are the happiest people in the world because they have been set free by Christ's death on the cross. His sacrifice frees us from both the guilt and power of sin. Free from having to earn acceptance with God. No longer do we worry about how to be good enough to be acceptable to God since Christ, God's Son, paid the price of sins, freeing us from condemnation and hell. Now "clothed with the robe of righteousness" supplied through faith by the perfect righteousness of Jesus, God does not see us in the nakedness of our sins, but sees us covered with his Son's perfection.

Live each and every day of this new year with the happiness of a newly released prisoner, for each day you receive forgiveness for all of your sins. Each day you live without fear of future punishment for your sins. Through your faith in Christ, the door of heaven is wide open to you. Live in Christ, in the blessed assurance that because of him all is well with your soul.

Seasonal Affective Disorder

Seasonal affective disorder (SAD) is a type of depression that's related to changes in seasons — seasonal affective disorder (SAD) begins and ends at about the same times every year. If you're like most people with SAD, your symptoms start in the fall and continue into the winter months, sapping your energy and making you feel moody. These symptoms often resolve during the spring and summer months.

There's no known way to prevent the development of seasonal affective disorder. However, if you take steps early on to manage symptoms, you may be able to prevent them from getting worse over time.

Things you can do on your own:

- Make your environment sunnier and brighter open shades
- Get outside—10-15 min of fresh air twice daily
- Exercise regularly—150 min per week
- Normalize sleep patterns—go to sleep/wake up same time

It's normal to have some days when you feel down. But if you feel down for days at a time and you can't get motivated to do activities you normally enjoy, see your healthcare provider.

PARKING NOTES: Parents, when dropping off or picking up your children for Sunday School, please park your vehicle in the parking lot and walk with your children in and out of the church building. Please do not park your vehicle anywhere in the circle drive in the upper level main entryway and canopy area of the church. There are many elderly and handicapped members who have difficulty getting into the entryway to our church because of the number of vehicles in the circle. There is one section of the entryway where the curb is sloped for wheelchairs and walkers. There is one handicapped accessible door in the entryway. It is important that these areas are not blocked. This is also a designated fire lane and emergency vehicle area. Reminder that by law our handicapped parking spaces are reserved for those who have a handicapped parking permit. Elder's Message

Happy New year! Did you make a New Years resolution? I personally am not one for New Year's resolutions. I think if something is worth doing it is worth doing all the time (or at least trying to do all the time). I put New year's resolutions in the "adiaphora" category. (Adiaphora is a theological term that refers to things that are neither commanded nor forbidden by God in Scripture.) So if you want to make a New Year's resolution - I wish you well. As a lifelong Christian who (like you?) has had my religious ups and downs, I know that there are things that I am free to do or not do as a Christian. But if I am honest, there have been times when I have not always thought of and treated my pastors (dozens who have served me) with complete respect, with honor, with love, and with kind and encouraging words. Was this ok? Is the manner in which I think of, and treat my pastor adiaphora? Think about that question for a moment. Think about if you may have done the things I have confessed. Then read these words Paul wrote in I Thess. 5:12-13, "Now we ask you, brothers and sisters, to acknowledge those who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you. Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other." Being a Pastor is hard - especially because there are people like me who, inexcusably, do not always, "hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work." They serve us on our journey through this life so that we may "run with perseverance the race marked out for us" (Heb. 12:1). They admonish us with the law when we transgress, They serve up God's grace when we repent of our sins. And they help us know what adiaphora is and what it is not. Thank our gracious and merciful God for the faithful servants he has provided to lead us. And as you "hold them in the highest regard in love" be sure to thank them as well! And if you, like me, confess your sins, I know they will share words of mercy such as I John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." God is good, so thank him and thank you Pastors for helping us stay on "the straight and narrow road that leads to life" (Matt. 7:13-14). And "Live in peace with each other", because when we don't, we make our Pastor's work even harder!

ucation for all ages, and outreach throughout 2025.

We pledged \$1,463,350 to our Building Fund, toward our goal of \$2.2 million. We will now be able to make our monthly mortgage payments for the next three years. In addition, we will be able to prepay a portion of our loan principal which will save us thousands of dollars in interest over time. We have also received general operating fund commitments for \$793,434 toward our 2025 budget goal of about \$1.9 million.

Teens quickly become so overwhelmed that these feelings can become their new reality and identity. Teens become so lost that they can't answer one crucial question, "Who am I?"

This book will help teens to understand that their identity can be found in Jesus Christ and the facts of who he is, what he has done, and what he has said. Those facts will provide a sure foundation for life and in turn will bring true feelings of happiness, joy, and peace. Teens who read this book will find help in living with certainty and confidence because they know the answer to the question, "Who am I?"
