We Are the Children of God

A little boy was standing on the sidewalk in the middle of a city block waiting for the bus. An older man approached him and asked why he was standing there. The little boy boldly told him, “I’m waiting for the bus.” The man laughed and said the bus stop was on the next block. Growing in Faith Update

October will be a busy month for the *Growing in Faith* Appeal. An Appeal Leadership Team, composed of roughly 15 members, has been formed and is coordinating the appeal. They have created letters, emails and brochures that you will be receiving over the next several weeks to help make you an informed member of the congregation.



The purpose of our Growing in Faith Appeal is twofold:

- 1) To make our monthly mortgage payments and possibly prepay a portion of our loan principal.
- 2) To support our annual congregation expenses for 2025, including 100% of the new ministry programs and increased operating costs of our church.

In June 2016, we retired our entire debt by the grace of God. Since that time, we added the expansion of our present facility. With this physical expansion we have been able to add new programs and opportunities to reach more souls with the gospel of Christ. Our present debt is now about \$3.0 million. The total cost for the new expansion was about \$8.5 million. By God's grace and your participation in the Growing in Faith Appeal we can continue to support the exciting changes taking place in our congregation and community, which include possible construction of a new pavilion on the southwest corner of our parking lot.

A special **Gathering Week** will be held at all services on October 19-23 where we will celebrate the Lord's blessing on our congregation. Everyone will receive a packet of information to help you pray and consider how the Lord may lead you to Grow in Faith and generosity through the Appeal.

The Appeal will culminate on **Commitment Week**, November 9-13. Watch for more information in the bulletin and through the mail.

Church Offerings made via Donor Advisory Fund or Qualified Charitable Distribution

Those members who give offerings through Donor Advisory Fund (DAF) or Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) will now notice a slight change to their yearly giving statements (this is applicable to both those that receive paper or emailed statements). These types of gifts are now included on giving statements and categorized as a non-deductible contribution. DAF or QCD will be itemized towards the bottom of the giving statement. The total non-deductible contribution amount will be listed in the upper right portion of the statement in a smaller font directly below any deductible amounts which will be in bold. Your giving statement may still show that you are “behind” in any pledge amounts that were fulfilled via DAF or QCD as a system limitation will not link non-deductible gifts to pledges. We hope this will change in the future, but for now be assured that any non-deductible gifts have been applied your pledge for the 2022-2024 Building in Faith campaign. Please consult your tax advisor for any questions or tax implications to your specific financial situation when considering making an offering via DAF or QCD. Parish Nurses' News — Body Mechanics

As we gear up for fall and winter here in Wisconsin, yard work does too. Between raking leaves and shoveling snow, our bodies, primarily our back, can take the brunt of the work. It is important to remember how to use correct body mechanics to help prevent an injury. Keep these ideas in mind as you work in your yard:

1. **Avoid poor posture:** Keep your back straight and shoulders back
2. **Avoid using your back:** When lifting or bending, use your hips and knees instead of your back
3. **Engage your core:** Keep your core tight as you work to help keep your spine straight
4. **Avoid overreaching:** Keep tools close to your body to prevent strain on your back and shoulders
5. **Take breaks and switch it up:** Listen to your body as you work. If you feel tired, take a break to avoid straining your body. Switch between different jobs to avoid continual strain in the same areas of your body.
6. **Teamwork:** Lessen the workload on everyone's body by working with multiple people
7. **Avoid lifting more than normal:** If you do not normally lift more than a gallon of milk, do not lift more than that while working outside.
